
Epping will present two programs: "Sustainable Gardens: Designs and Plants for Greener Gardens" and "Small Trees with Big Impact".

**Chuck Martin** has been happily traipsing off to work as the Curator of Woody Plants at The Dow Garden in Midland, Michigan since 1994. Chuck started his journey at MSU where he earned a bachelor's degree in ornamental horticulture. After working as a garden caretaker on a private estate, Chuck went on to earn a master's degree in ornamental horticulture at the University of Wisconsin. An internship at the Arnold Arboretum took him to Boston, MA., before he returned to earn an MBA from Northwood University. Chuck's area of expertise includes: woody plants, perennials, Michigan's native plants, invasives, pruning, grounds maintenance, and rose care and culture. Chuck is happy to share his knowledge, and pens a weekly column on plants for the Midland Daily News.

Jeff Epping has served as Director of Horticulture at Olbrich Gardens in Madison, WI since 1994, overseeing horticultural operations and garden designs for the display gardens which showcase the best garden-worthy plants for the region. Epping and his staff practice sustainable gardening, and their commitment is reflected in Olbrich's environmentally friendly and award winning gardens.

Epping holds both bachelor's and master's degrees in ornamental horticulture from the University of Wisconsin. Before coming to Olbrich, Jeff worked at the Chicago Botanic Garden. An avid traveler, Jeff has studied and photographed gardens, throughout the U.S., U.K., Thailand, and the south of France. He regularly lectures on the topic of landscape plants and design for northern gardens.
